

Teaching Artist - Theatre

Part-Time (20 hours per week, 75% local travel)

Shea's Performing Arts Center seeks an experienced teaching artist to execute standards-aligned theatre workshops and residencies with community partners in Buffalo and Western New York. This position includes some evenings and weekends and reports to the Director of Arts Engagement and Education.

Essential Functions:

- Curate performing arts-related experiences for community stakeholders with a broad range of identities and backgrounds
- Develop theatre-based curricula for residencies and workshops with a variety of learning objectives
- Teach multiple residencies in schools and organizations across Buffalo and Western New York
- Schedule and conduct planning meetings with educators before, during, and after residencies
- Research, analyze, and report emerging trends in arts education
- Collect, evaluate, and maintain relevant data about program participants
- Assist Arts Engagement and Education team with on-site workshops, performances and events
- Serve as an ambassador of Shea's Performing Arts Center, representing the values and philosophy of the organization
- Perform other duties as assigned

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in a related field (Theatre, Dance, Writing, etc.), combined with extensive performance experience
- At least three years of experience as a classroom teacher or teaching artist
- Cultural competency to engage individuals with diverse identities and backgrounds
- Strong skills in writing, interpersonal communication, and public speaking
- Reliable transportation and valid driver's license

Preferred Qualifications:

- English/Spanish bilingual
- Strong background in community organizing
- Experience with youth development, trauma informed care, and restorative justice practices
